

Final Assignment:

As a final Assignment, an extended abstract of a research article in preparation will be submitted as if it were to be submitted for evaluation at a conference or scientific journal. The article should be no longer than 3000 words and should contain the following sections:

- Abstract
- Introduction
- Methodology
- Results
- Discussion
- Conclusion

A cover letter should be attached to the article explaining its importance and why it is relevant for publication.

In case there you still have not defined a methodology, different approaches can be presented, as well as their characteristics, advantages, disadvantages, origins, elements, phases, concepts, etc.

Likewise, in case there are no results, the results of experiments or research published by other authors can be commented, analyzed, presented, as well as their characteristics, comparing them, analyzing them in relation to a specific theory or methodology, etc.

In the case of the discussion, it is proposed that arguments be put forward based on different starting hypotheses and that the relationship between theory, methodology and results be highlighted. Here it is possible to establish to what extent the results are considered significant or not, and the development of a critical (constructive) analysis is expected.

Conclusions should provide a summary of the application and the results obtained, including a summary of the discussion as well as elements for the development of future research.

As for the format, there are two options to choose from:

Option 1: Free format

The format of the sections as well as the subsections is free, but must be consistent. For references, you can also use any format you wish, but it must be consistent and research articles must contain the Doi.

Figures, tables and equations are allowed. In case of doubts about the format, it is recommended to consult the following guidelines for authors:
