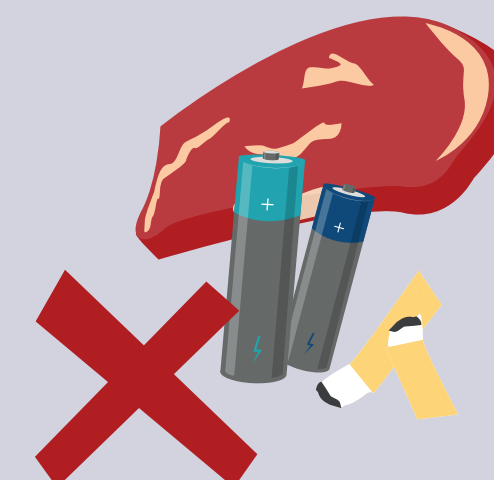
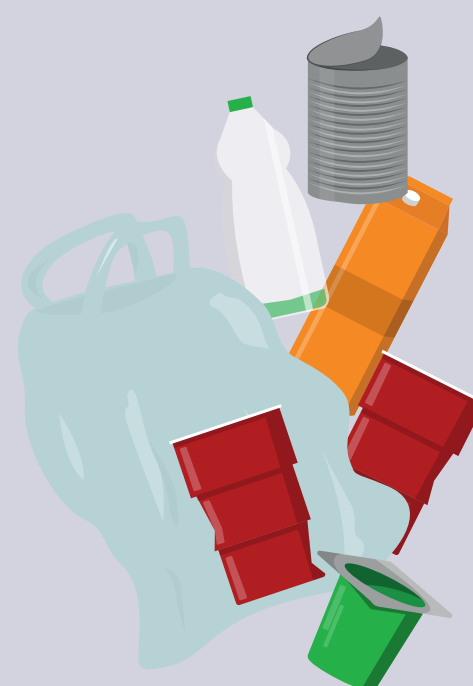

HOW TO RECYCLE?

Blue Bin: All packaging made of paper, cardboard or carton without food residue
(Packaging should be cut into small pieces or folded)

For example:

- flour/sugar/paper carrier bags
- egg/chocolate/pasta/pizza boxes
- cardboard wrapping of yoghurt pots
- magazines, catalogues, newspaper
- books, letters, post cards, envelopes
- exercise books, advertising brochures
- paper bags baking goods/meat/fruit
- paper filling materials from shipping packet



- Kitchen roll and paper tissues
- Butter wrappers, soup/sauce bags
- Milk/beverage cartons
- Polystyrene, bubble wraps
- Wallpaper, tins and cans
- Special paper (e.g. photo paper)
- Wood wool/boxes
- Glass, metals, wall paper



Yellow Bin: Is only for used and completely empty packaging which is not made of paper, cardboard, carton or glass.
(The items do not need to be rinsed)

For example:

- Plastic pots of cream, yogurt, margarine, quark etc.
- Milk and beverage cartons (Tetra Packs)
- Plastic bags, plastic bottles, e.g. shampoo bottles
- Ready meal trays
- Small bags and pouches e.g. pasta bags, nuts etc.
- Nets of citrus fruits, potatoes, onions etc.
- Aluminium, tin and plastic lids
- Food cans
- Any tubes, e.g. toothpaste tubes, mustard tubes
- Cleaning agent bottles
- Butter wrapper
- Packaging with aluminium



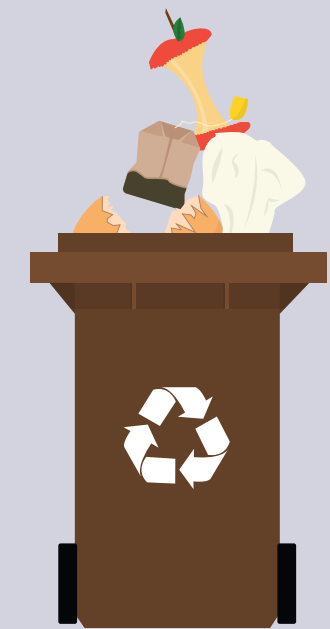
- Old clothes (including shoes)
- Batteries, electrical appliances
- Leftover food
- CDs, DVDs, floppy disks, video cassettes
- Ink cartridges
- Paper tissues, paper, cardboard
- Toothbrushes
- Waste glass
- Cigarette butts, lighters
- Rubber, wood wool



Brown Bin: Materials that are biodegradable and do not interfere with the recycling process:

For example:

- Food leftovers
- Eggshells, coffee filters & tea bags
- Kitchen fats (solid, wrapped in paper)
- Used paper tissues/napkins
- Fruits and vegetable waste (e.g. potato, onion peel, shells of fruits/nuts, salad)
- Garden waste (e.g. lawn/hedge cut, grass, leaves)



- Raw meat waste and bones
- Recyclable materials: plastic bags & other plastics, clothes, textiles, paper, cardboard
- Packaging (fruit nets, plastic plant pots)
- Non-recyclable waste: diapers, wallpaper
- Cigarette butts, coal & wood ash
- Street sweeping, sanitary pads
- Problem waste: batteries, paints, varnishes, solvents, medicines, acids & alkalis



Glass containers are located at supermarkets (Rewe, Real)

- Rinse the glasses before desposing them
- Sort them by color and put them in the right container --> other colors (e.g. blue) can be disposed with green glasses
- Lids can be disposed together with glasses
